WHAT TO SEE? WHERE TO GO?



ONE OF THE MOST MAGNIFICENT SLOVENIAN CASTLES

Visit one of the most magnificent castles in Slovenia, which is home to impressive exhibitions of the Ptuj-Ormož Regional Museum. The Ptuj Castle also offers a picture-perfect view over the tiled roofs and cobbled streets of the oldest Slovenian city.

Orpheus Monument

MARBLE ROMAN HEADSTONE
This marble monument was erected to honor the memory of Marcus Valerius
Verus, who was the mayor of Poetovio
(Ptuj) in the 2nd century AD.



Minorite Monastery

A SPLENDID MONASTERY WITH A
MARVELOUS LIBRARY
After the fires and bombing, the
13th-century monastery was
renovated, and now boasts a library
with over 5000 books, some of them
dating as far back as the 16th
century.



The Dominican Monastery

ART BETWEEN MONASTERY WALLS
The Dominican complex has preserved its medieval architecture, with baroque features added at the end of the 17th and beginning of 18th centuries. T

THE LEGEND OF THE LORD'S CLOCK It is practically impossible to miss the city tower. It is interesting because of not only its baroque onion dome, but also the antique monuments in its walls.

VIENNA ARCHITECT'S GREAT MASTERPIECE

One of the most prominent buildings in the old city center was designed by Vienna architect Max Ferstl at the beginning of the 20th century.



Mihelič Gallery

PTUJ'S ARTISTIC LEGACY

The Mihelič Gallery was named after the great Slovenian artist France Mihelič, who donated his extensive collection of prints and his paintings to the city of Ptuj. It is housed in the old tower at the Drava River, which was built in 1551 and was a part of the city's defense system in the Renaissance.

Church of St. George

AN ECLECTIC MIXTURE OF STYLE
The main parish church boasts a
gorgeous interior with striking
Laib's three-winged altar, choir
bench from the 15th century, and
the statute of its patron saint St.
George defeating a dragon.





BARS & CAFE'S

Bodi Cafe (The owner's mission is to turn beer drinking into a gourmet experience, and beer lovers can select from over 100 different beers here.)

Bo Cafe (Have some tea on Ptuj's most charming square, while admiring the gorgeous buildings on Slovenski trg, the Orpheus Monument and the city tower.)

Kipertz Cafe – Mitra Hotel (The café operating on the site, where coffee was roasted already in 1786, will serve you a cup of delicious, locally roasted Kipertz coffee.)

Restaurant Grabar (high end culinary experience)

Restaurant Amadeus (traditional regional cuisine)

COVID REGULATIONS

IMPORTANT COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS:

PCT = RVT CONDITION (RECOVERED – VACCINATED – TESTED; if tested quick (HAG) test not older than 24 hours and PCR 48 hours) and ID DOCUMENT IS REQUIRED

- To enter Slovenia
- At all cultural events
- For entering the indoor areas of bars, restaurants, accommodation facilities.
- Organizers of cultural events and providers must verify that visitors meet the requirements of the rtv condition before entering.
- Rapid tests are available at four locations.

IT IS OBLIGATORY TO WEAR A FACE MASK IN ALL CLOSED PUBLIC SPACES.

PLEASE BE MINDFUL OF COUGH HYGIENE AND REGULAR HAND WASHING. DISINFECTANTS WILL BE AVAILABLE AT THE EVENT AND HOTEL AT ALL TIMES. THE ORGANIZERS WILL MAKE SURE THAT THE EVENT IS HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH ALL REGULATIONS AND WILL BE SAFE FOR GUESTS AND VISITORS.
